JESS RUNS FOR AMIGOS



As I run, I often think about some of the incredible people I met in 2022 whilst visiting Development Kira Farm Centre, run by **Amigos** Worldwide Uganda, especially the dedicated staff and inspiring young people who had been through so much. Amigos is working to create sustainable and lasting change.

Each year, Kira Farm welcomes up to 50 young trainees. They learn vocational, business, communication and conservation farming skills, as well as conflict resolution. They often arrive broken, dejected and without hope, but after a year, they re-enter their communities, becoming respected leaders and change-makers, and support the sustainable community development programme. The two week course I helped with in November 2022 is called Inspire. It aims to bring hope, love and restoration to the trainees by encouraging and empowering them to be everything God created them to be and equip them to pass this on to their communities.

My group of five girls shared stories about their families, their pasts and their dreams for the future. It was such an honour to be trusted by them. The star-sticker game affirmations were my favourite teaching activity. Each person had a list of words that linked with a colour. You went up to people, chose a word to affirm them, saying "you are joyful", "you are a good listener" etc. and then stuck a star on them until everyone was covered! We also talked about things people have said over us or to us, names they have called us, things they have done to us, and how that can break a bit of your heart each time, and how God brings healing and wholeness from brokenness. We wrote them down, burnt them and then were crowned with a floral tiara.

I will be running the London Marathon for Amigos in April this year if you would like to support me.




LEGACY FUND UPDATE
