Game

V1-2 Saul was an enemy of Christians. He did bad things-capturing, imprisoning and putting them to death.

Do you think God would use a person like this to do God's work?

Time to open the Bible

Acts 9:1-19

V17-19 Ananias prayed and Saul's sight returned. He got up and was baptised.

Saul realised he was wrong and changed. A dramatic change!

Do you think God can still change people today?

V3-9 On the road to Damascus, Saul was blinded by a light.

- Who made him blind?
- Why do you think this happened?
- How many days was he blind?



V10-16 Jesus told Ananias to go find Saul and pray for him to see again.

It can be hard to pray for people we do not get on with. Is there someone you find it hard to get on with or who has upset you? Spend some time asking God to help you forgive them and pray for them.

Let's open the bible one more time...

Acts 9: 19-31

The disciples were afraid of Saul and suspicious of him. How could anyone change like that? How do you think you would have felt if you had been one of the disciples there?
